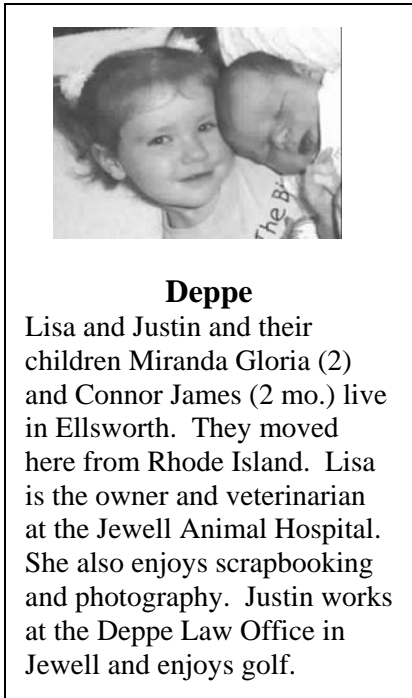


Quint

What is Lay Formation? The Lay Formation Program in the Archdiocese of Dubuque prepares men and women to broaden their understanding of their baptismal call, expand their spiritual development, and explore the meaning and purpose of being a servant. Lay Formation is a three year process. The themes are:

- Year 1 – Living the life of Faith
- Year 2 – Reflecting the life of Faith
- Year 3 – Sharing the life of Faith

Each year begins with a retreat weekend in September. Monthly sessions are conducted covering bible study, doctrine, papal councils, encyclicals and various other Church topics.
